- Design and implement programs that serve the company's mission of providing creative opportunities for people of all ages through community and educational outreach residencies and workshops.
- Create annual budget and present quarterly financial reports for the board.
- Oversee the board of directors and act as a liaison between the board, the ensemble, funders and the public.
- Develop and coordinate support, logistics, and marketing for fundraising events.
- Craft internal and external company communication including email newsletters, digital announcements, press releases, and social media announcements. Oversee communication with the press.
- Write grant and project proposals, develop proposal budgets. Write final reports.
- Design and coordinate development campaigns.
- Develop and build relationships with an external community of funders, service organizations, donors and organizational partners.
- Build and develop a regional network of peer organizations for mutual support. Establish and maintain programming to strengthen this network.
